- Ensure assembly points are a safe distance from the building and clearly marked.

Role Assignments:

- Assign specific roles and responsibilities to key personnel, such as building incident command, building response and floor wardens.
- Ensure that all assigned personnel are trained and aware of their duties during an evacuation.

Communication Plan:

- Establish a reliable communication system to notify occupants of an emergency and provide instructions.
- Use multiple communication methods, such as public address systems, text alerts, or mobile apps.

Evacuation Procedures:

- Develop detailed evacuation procedures that outline the steps to be taken during an emergency.


